He practiced law with the Jackson, MS firm of Brunini, Grantham, Grower, and Hewes and was a faculty member of the Jackson School of Law from 1972 until 1974. Since 1974 he has been a cotton, soybean, and rice producer in Sunflower County, Mississippi. Before his selection as President of Staplcotn in 1986, Mr. Eastland was elected as a director of Staplcotn in 1977 and served as Chairman of the Board from 1981 until 1986.

He is Vice President and Director of Amcot, Director of Delta Council, a Director of The Seam, LLC, Advisor to the 2008 Board of Directors of Cotton Council International, and Advisor to the Board of Directors of National Cotton Council.

In addition, he is a licensed layreader in the Episcopal Diocese of Mississippi. He is Past Chairman of National Cotton Council, Past President and Chairman of Cotton Council International, past member of the Board of Managers of the New York Cotton Exchange, and a past Director of the Memphis Branch Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, and former member of the Board of Governors of the New York Board of Trade.
