## ORDER OF DISMISSAL DUE TO PARALLEL PROCEEDING

Respondents' counsel has filed notice that the respondents in this action are named as defendants in a CFTC-initiated federal civil action that has, among other things, resulted in an appointment of a receiver to take control of their assets. A review of the appointment order attached to the notice reveals that the receiver has been granted authority to hear customer claims. Counsel for respondents correctly cites CFTC rule 12.24 as requiring dismissal of this action.

Accordingly, pursuant to the requirements of CFTC Rule 12.24(d)(2), this proceeding is DISMISSED without prejudice to complainant's right to assert the claims before the receiver.
